1 Introduction

1.1 Product Introduction

The handheld thermography camera is a camera with thermal and optical images. The built-in high-sensitivity IR detector and highperformance sensor detect the temperature changes and measure the real-time temperature.

It helps the users to find the risky part and lower their property loss. The device supports live view, capturing snapshots, etc. It is mainly applied to various industries, such as building, HVAC, and auto industry.

1.2 Main Function

Temperature Measurement

Device detects the real-time temperature, and display it on the screen.

Alarm

Device outputs audible and visual alarm when the target's temperature is higher than the threshold value.

SuperIR

Device supports **SuperIR** to increase the image quality.

 Mobile Phone: You can view live view, capture snapshots, record videos via HIKMICRO Viewer app on your phone. You can also analyze radiometric images, generate and share a report via the app. Scan the QR codes to download the





3 Preparation

3.1 Charge Device

Steps:

- 1. Open the top cover of the camera.
- Connect the device interface and the power adapter with Type-C cable.



3.2 Power On/Off

Power On

Remove the lens cover, and hold S for over three seconds to turn on the device. You can observe the target when the interface of the device is stable.

Power Off


When the device is on, hold the for three seconds to power off the device.

Set Auto Power-off Duration

In the live view interface, press 🕲 and go to More Settings -> Auto Power-off to set the automatic shutdown time for device as required.

3.3 Interface Description

The interface of different models may vary. Take the actual product for reference.



4 Display Settings

4.1 Set Image Mode

You can set image modes of the device. **Image Mode** is only supported by certain models. Please refer to the actual device or the datasheet.

Steps:

- Select an image mode by the following ways:
 - Go to Settings → Image Settings → Image Mode, and select a preferred image mode.
 - Press in live view to switch image modes.
 - Thermal: Display the thermal image only.
 - Fusion: Fuse the optical image with the thermal image. The fused image with clear edge is displayed in this mode.
 - PIP: Display a part of the thermal image on the optical image.
- Visual: Display the visual image only.
 Optional: When selecting the fusion mode, you need to select the distance in Image Settings → Parallax Correction according to the distance to the target, so as to better overlap the thermal and optical images.
- 3 Press 🔄 to save and exit.
- 🔃 Note

Your camera will periodically perform a selfcalibration to optimize image quality and measurement accuracy. In this process the image will pause briefly and you will hear a "click" as a shutter moves in front of the detector. The self-calibration will be more frequent during the startup or in very cold or hot environments. This is a normal part of operation to ensure optimum performance for your camera.

4.2 Set Palettes

The palettes allow you to select the desired colors.

Steps:

- 1 Select a palette by the following ways:
 - Go to Settings → Palettes, and press
 to switch palettes.
 - Press in live view to switch palettes.

2 Press 🗅 to save and exit.

4.3 Set Level & Span

Set a display temperature range and palette only works for targets within the temperature range. You can get better image contrast by adjusting the level & span parameters.

Steps:

- 1 In the live view interface, press 🕲 to show the menu.
- 2 Press / , and select Level & Span.
- 3 Select Setting Mode, and press 🕲 to switch auto and manual adjustment.
 - In Auto mode, the device adjusts display temperature range automatically.
 - In Manual mode, select Parameters to enter the setting interface. Press to lock or unlock the max.
 temperature or min. temperature, and press () to adjust unlocked value. Or, unlock the max. and min.
 temperature, and press () to increase or decrease the individual

values while remaining the same

temperature range. 4 Press 🖃 to save and exit.

4.4 Set Color Distribution

Set the color distribution to change the distribution of colors in the image. Different color distributions facilitate you to better analyze the image.

Steps:

- 1 In the live view interface, press [™] and go to **More Settings** → **Color Distribution**.
- Select a color distribution mode.
 - Linear: Liner mode is used to detect small high temperature targets in low temperature background. Linear color distribution enhances and displays more details of high temperature targets, which is good for checking small high temperature defective areas such as cable connectors.
 - Histogram: Histogram mode is used to detect temperature distribution in large areas. Histogram color distribution enhances high temperature targets and remains some details of low temperature objects in the area, which is good for discovering small low temperature targets such as cracks.

3 Press D to save and exit.
```

💷 Note

Color Distribution is not supported in manual Level & Span. Please refer to Set Level & Span to select a setting mode.

4.5 Set Brand Logo

The brand logo is a manufacturer logo displayed on the lower left corner of the screen. Steps:

- In the live view interface, press and go to More Settings → Brand Logo.
- 2 Press 🖾 to enable the function.

3 Press D to save and exit.

Result

The brand logo is added on the live view interface and snapshots.

5 Temperature Measurement

The temperature measurement function provides the real-time temperature of the scene. The temperature information is displayed on the left top of your screen. The function is enabled by default.

5.1 Set Measurement Parameters

You can set temperature measurement parameters to improve the accuracy of temperature measurement. Steps:

- 1 In the live view interface, press 🕲 to show the menu.
- Press / v to select desired parameters.
- 3 Press 🖾 to go to the setting interface.

 - **Distance**: Set the distance between the target and the device.
 - Unit: Go to More Settings → Unit to set the temperature unit.
 - Temperature Range: Select a temperature range or select Auto Switch. The device can detect the temperature and switch temperature range automatically in Auto Switch mode.
- 4 Press ☐ to save and exit.

5.2 Set Measurement Tool

Steps:

- 1 In the live view interface, press 🖾 to show the menu.
- 2 Press / , and select Measurement.
- 3 Select the hot spot, cold spot, center spot, or the user-defined spots that you want to show on live view.

4 Optional: You can customize the userdefined spots if needed.

- Go to Measurement, select a userdefined spot, and press ¹/₂.
- Press 1/ / / to adjust the position of the spot.
- 3) Press the trigger to finish setting.

5 The device shows the real-time temperature on the upper left side of live view interface.

5.3 Enhance High-Temperature Target

In target enhancement function, when the target's temperature is higher than the set value, the target will become red. **Steps:**

- In the live view interface, press and select Palettes.
- 2 Press / T to select Above Alarm.
- 3 Press and select Temperature to configure the enhancement temperature threshold. When the temperature of target is higher than the set value, the target will be red in live view.
- 4 Press D to save and exit.
 - 🗊 Note
 - Press in live view to quickly switch to Above Alarm.
 - Above Alarm is only supported by certain models. Please take the actual product for reference.

5.4 Set Temperature Alarm

Set the alarm rules and the device will alarm when the temperature triggers the rule. Flashing Alarm is only supported by certain models. Steps:

- 1 In the live view interface, press 🕲 to show the menu.
- 2 Press / , and select Alarm.
- 3 Press S to enable the function, and you can enable Flashing Alarm or Audible Warning as required.
 - Flashing Alarm: The LED light flashes when the target temperature exceeds the alarm threshold (only supported by certain models).
 - Audible Warning: The device beeps when target temperature exceeds the alarm threshold.

🗇 Note

The LED light will turn off automatically after enabling flashing alarm.

4 Select Measurement to set the alarm rule. Select Alarm Threshold to set the threshold temperature. When the target's temperature is higher or lower than the threshold value, the device will output alarm.

5 Press 🗅 to save and exit.

6 Capture Snapshots

6.1 Capture One Image

You can capture snapshots in live view, and a thumbnail of the snapshot is displayed in live view. The snapshot will be automatically saved in the albums.

Steps:

- 1 In the live view interface, you can capture snapshots by the following ways.
 - Press and release the trigger in live view to capture snapshots.
 - Hold the trigger in live view to locate the target with laser light, and release the trigger to capture snapshots (only supported by certain models).

💷 Note

In the live view interface, press [™] and go to More Settings → Laser to turn on/off laser light. Laser is only supported by certain models.

- 2 Optional: If the thermal images are exported and viewed on a high resolution screen, enable SuperIR in the menu before capturing. Resolution of captured images with SuperIR is 4 times higher the original one.
- 3 Optional: If a visual image is needed to be saved separately, go to Settings → Image Settings to enable Save Visual Image (only supported by the models with optical lens).

What to do next:

You can view and manage the snapshots in the album, and export them to PC.

🗊 Note

- You cannot capture snapshots when the device is connected with PC.
- Save Visual Image is only supported by certain models.

6.2 View Snapshots

Steps:

1 In the live view interface, press 🕲 to show the menu.

- 2 Press ▲/▼ to select Albums, and press ७ to enter the album.
- 3 Press A/ T to select the picture, and press to view it.
- 4 Optional: Press Solution to delete picture in picture view interface. Press A/T to switch the picture.
- 5 Press 🗅 to exit.

6.3 Export Snapshots

Purpose:

Connect the device to your PC with Type-C cable, and then you can export the captured snapshots. You can also export snapshots via HIKMICRO Viewer. See *HIKMICRO Viewer Connection*.

- Hotspot function is only supported by certain models. Please refer to the actual device.

9 HIKMICRO Viewer Connection

The device supports both Wi-Fi connection and WLAN hotspot. Connect the device to HIKMICRO Viewer app, and you can control the device via mobile app. This function is only supported by certain models. Please refer to the actual product for reference.

9.1 Connect via Wi-Fi

Before You Start

Download and install HIKMICRO Viewer on your phone.

Steps:

- Turn on the device hotspot and complete the hotspot settings. See *Connect Device to Wi-Fi* for instructions.
- 2 Connect your phone to the Wi-Fi network that the device is in.
- 3 Launch the app and follow the startup wizard to create, and register an account.
- 4 Search and add the device to the mobile client.

9.2 Connect via Hotspot

 Please purchase it separately. The recommended model is HM-B201-MACRO.

- In the live view interface, press and go to More Settings → Macro Mode.
- 2 Press 🖾 to enable the function.
- 3 Press 🔄 to save and exit.

🗇 Note

 After enabling the macro mode, only the emissivity can be modified. Parameters such as distance, image mode, parallax correction, and measurement range cannot be modified. After disabling this function, the parameters will be restored to the previous set values, and the temperature range will be set to auto switch.

11 Cast Screen

The device supports casting screen to PC by UVC protocol-based client software or player. You can connect the device to your PC via a type-C cable, and cast the real-time live view of the device to your PC.

Before You Start

• Connect the device and PC with supplied Type-C cable.

• Download the software and install the client on your PC.

Steps:

- In the live view interface, press and go to More Settings → USB Cast Screen.
- 2 Press 🥨 to enable the function.
- 3 Open the UVC client software on your PC, and you can view the live view and operation of the device.

12 Set LED Light

In the live view interface, press We , and go to Flashlight to turn on/off the LED light.

 LED Light is only supported by certain models.
 Please refer to the actual device.

13.1 View Device Information

In the live view interface, press [™] and go to More Settings → About to view the device information.

13.2 Set Time and Date

In the live view interface, press [™] and go to **More Settings** → **Time and Date** to set time and date information.

13.3 Set Language

In the live view interface, press [™] and go to More Settings → Language to set the menu language.

13.4 Format Storage

Steps:

- In the live view interface, press Signary and go to More Settings → Format Storage.
- Press and select OK to start formatting storage.

Format storage before first use of it.

13.5 Upgrade

Before You Start

• Download the upgrade package from the official website first.

 Go to Settings → More Settings → Auto
 Power-off to turn off auto power-off to prevent auto shutdown during the upgrade.

Steps:

- Connect the device to your PC with Type-C cable and open the detected disk.
- Unzip the upgrade package to obtain the upgrade file.
- 3 Copy the upgrade file and replace it to the root directory of the device.
- 4 Disconnect the device from your PC.
- 5 Reboot the device and then it will upgrade automatically. The upgrading process will be displayed in the main interface.

💷 Note

After the upgrading, the device automatically reboot. You can view the current version in Settings \rightarrow More Settings \rightarrow About.

13.6 Restore Device

In the live view interface, press [™] and go to **More Settings** → **Restore Device** to initialize the device and restore default settings.

- Make sure the environment temperature is above 0°C (32°F).

Q: Capturing fails.

- A: Examine the items below:
- Whether the device is connected to your PC and the capture function is unavailable.
- 2. Whether the storage space is full.
- 3. Whether the device is low-battery.

Q: The PC cannot identify the camera.

- A: Examine whether the device is connected to your PC with standard Type-C cable.
- Q: The camera cannot be operated or no responding.
- A: Hold 🐚 to reboot the camera.
